Hole-In-One Insurance



The below rules are regulations are intended to clarify the Ptarmigan Men's Golf Association's Hole-In-One Insurance program. This is a voluntary program that was created to, and is intended to, help defray the typical bar costs for the member.

Rules and Regulations

1. Hole-In-One Insurance is available to all Ptarmigan Men's Golf Association Members in good standing. Non-members are not eligible for insurance.
2. The insurance is only good for play at the Ptarmigan Country Club.
3. Insurance cost is \$20.00. The PMGA recommends checks so there is a canceled receipt. In the past, cash has been misplaced or lost so please bring a check to the event/pro shop if at all possible.
4. The Insurance usually covers five (5) to six (6) hole-in-ones per year. The actual number of hole-in-ones that can be awarded in a given year is governed by the number of players who sign up. An award can be granted for every twenty players.
5. A player must have insurance paid prior to a subject Hole-in-One to be eligible for an award.
6. A person may win more than one time in a given year subject the rules within.
7. In the event all awards are given out for a year, and there is no previous year reserve to support additional awards, insurance is deemed unavailable for the remainder of that year. Members will be notified if this occurs.
8. The period defined by the Colorado Golf Association's (CGA) score posting season is the only time a member may claim a Hole-in-One award. This is typically from mid March to mid November. Hole-in-ones outside this season are not eligible, thus mid November to mid March are black out dates.
9. At least two witnesses, plus himself are required for the hole-in-one to be eligible. The person must also complete a minimum of a 9-hole round to constitute a legal hole-in-one and qualify for insurance.
10. The PMGA member who qualifies for a hole-in-one will receive \$400 from the insurance program. The PMGA member who gets a hole-in-one is responsible for contacting the PMGA executive board and the Pro Shop. The board will confirm the qualification with the Head Professional.
11. The Ptarmigan Club Member is responsible for any and all bar bills incurred as a result of the hole-in-one. The PMGA is not responsible for these costs.
12. The Ptarmigan Men's Golf Association is solely responsible for the bookkeeping, administration, and payouts of this program. This is not a Ptarmigan Country Club program and only PMGA members in good standing are eligible. The PMGA Executive Board may determine at anytime to discontinue the program if deemed in the best interests of the membership.
13. There are no billings for hole-in-one insurance. It is the member's responsibility to sign up and make payment. If, in any year, the hole-in-ones are exhausted per these rules, an announcement will be made to the membership, via email and the PMGA web site, as to process for eligibility during the remaining part of the season.
14. The PMGA recommends all interested parties sign up as early in the season as possible in order to remain eligible at all times. This is typically during the Winter Golf Challenge, or the season opening Ice Breaker.
